Purpose:

To provide a \$1,500 scholarship to two graduating Oldham County seniors intending to pursue a posthigh school course study in conservation, environmental science, agriculture, or a related field at either a college/university or another post-secondary educational institution.

About H. Glenn Watson

The H. Glenn Watson Conservation Award is given in memory of conservation educator Glenn Watson. Glenn Watson (1958-2013) served on the Oldham County Conservation District Board (OCCD) for 14 years. He also was the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Conservation Officer for Oldham County for 22 years. Glenn visited local schools, gave conservation education programs, and promoted the fish and wildlife camp programs at Camp Earl Wallace for children of the region. He organized river clean-ups for the Westport community and supported educational programs for OCCD that included the Monarch Butterfly School Program and the public tree give-away program each spring. The H. Glenn Watson Conservation Award was established in 2014 to benefit students interested in promoting conservation programs as they pursue their career dreams.

Criteria:

- 1. Applicant must be an Oldham County student pursuing post-high school studies in conservation, environmental science, agriculture, or a related field.
- 2. Applicant must be a graduating high school senior in the year of the award.
- 3. Applicant must complete the process listed below.

Application process:

Applicant must submit the following items:

1. Completed application form (if handwritten, please write legibly).

- 2. One (1) letter of recommendation. This can be from a high school teacher, administrator, counselor, employer, or an individual with significant knowledge of the applicant's experiences and involvement (non-family).
- 3. A recent high school transcript with cumulative grade point average.
- 4. Personal essay on a separate piece of paper (see #18 below).

Deadline to submit the application is **Wednesday**, **April 10**, **2024**. Applications postmarked after this date will not be considered.
